

Town of Minto Pickleball Courts  
COVID – 19 - Rules for the Use of the Pickleball Courts

These rules are to ensure the safety of all users and to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

#### Entrance Restrictions and Requirements

- If you are experiencing any of the following you are prohibited from using the courts:
  - Symptoms of COVID-19 as listed on Health Unit website
  - Close contact with a confirmed or probably COVID-19 case
  - Travel outside of Canada in the past 14 days
  - Instructions from local public health authorities to self-isolate due to travel or contact history
- Access is restricted to up to 25 participants at any given time
- Sign-in required upon arrival (in case close-contact tracing is required)
- No pets (unless service animals) at the courts
- Follow protocols required by the Province, Health Unit, and any other regulatory body

#### Physical Distancing

- Maintain a distance of at least 2 metres or 6 feet from other people (excluding members of the same household) when not playing

#### Equipment & Structures and Objects

- Town staff will set out equipment required to play
- Town staff will clean equipment with disinfectant wipes after each session
- Bringing your own equipment where possible is strongly encouraged
- The structures and objects in and around this amenity are being sanitized regularly

#### Hand Hygiene

- Hand sanitizer is in place at the courts
- Hands should be wiped clean before applying the hand sanitizer
- Perform hand hygiene: 1) Upon entering the courts; 2) Upon leaving the courts

#### Use of Non-Medical (homemade masks)

- Wearing a non-medical mask (handmade cloth mask) or facial covering is required when entering and moving about the arena; it can be removed during the activity

#### Subject to Change

- These rules are subject to change
- The courts may be closed if unsafe social distancing is observed

#### Assumption of Risk

- By visiting any facilities and publicly accessible spaces you voluntarily assume all risks including any risk of injury, loss, damage, and possible exposure to a communicable disease, including COVID-19
